MTFI Refund Policy: If you are unable to attend the course date you had signed up for, your deposit may be applied to another instruction date or course, but must be redeemed within six (6) months of the course date you originally planned to attend. There are no refunds for courses that you could not attend; however, if the course is cancelled by MTFI, then you will be refunded in full.

<u>Our Facility</u>: Our modern facility is air conditioned with two full sized classrooms each with big screen televisions for PowerPoint presentations. We have a full kitchen, clean restrooms, and a wood stove for the winter months. For the shooting range, we have an outdoor range and a covered/protected portion of the building. This area has stand-alone heaters for cold days (we shoot no matter the weather).

30 to 45 Minute Lunch Break: We suggest that you bring your lunch with you, as food served in this area can be a bit slow. We have a full kitchen available for your convenience.

Instructor Bio: This course is taught by George Carr, MTFI Associate

Firearms Instructor. George spent 25 years as an FBI Special Agent. During that time, George served as a Firearms and Tactical Instructor, SWAT Team Member and FBI Sniper. George was responsible for designing and implementing training for over 750 agents in the Los Angeles Field Office and taught new agents firearms training at the FBI Academy. George is certified as a Force Science Analyst which focuses on law enforcement response and human performance under stress. George is a NRA Certified Pistol Instructor and State of Montana Firearms Instructor. Prior to joining the FBI, George was an attorney.

<u>Course Description:</u> Students will be taught tactical movement within a home or other structures, then integrate that new skill with the computer simulator. An inert laser enabled, recoiling inert handgun will be used. Scenarios will include multiple "shoot/don't shoot" scenarios on a video screen. The student's shots are recorded and reviewed during an after action critique following each scenario.

Instructors can vary the outcomes of the scenarios based on the student's behavior. This training is one of the most realistic methods of testing a student's knowledge of use of force and how they perform under stress. Students will be taught tactical movement within a home or other structures, then integrate that new skill with the computer simulator. An inert laser-enabled, recoiling inert handgun will be used. <u>Firearms In the Training Center</u>: If you own your own firearm, please bring it to train with! *Please do not bring loaded handguns or ammunition into the classroom*. If you cannot store it in your vehicle, please present it to an MTFI Instructor for safe storage.

<u>Weather and Live-Fire:</u> The length of the live-firearm portion of the course is dependent upon winter cold weather conditions. When cold, we will usually shoot for one hour straight. If the temperatures are not favorable or safe for shooting, then the indoor computer simulator will be used.

Live-Fire Gear to Include:

• **ATTENTION:** Due to safety concerns involving the Sig Suaer P320 firing without activating the trigger, reported injuries and deaths involving its use; we have determined that until further notice this handgun will not be allowed to be used for training at our facility.

- 100 rounds of FMJ practice ammunition.
- A quality holster, three (3) magazines and an ammunition pouch.
- For safety concerns, Blackhawk Serpa holsters are not allowed on the gun range.
- Eye & ear protection.
- Hat, sunscreen and or the appropriate clothing for weather conditions. Sturdy closed toe boots or hiking shoes. Do not wear flip-flops or Birkenstock type shoes.
- A Special Safety Note To Ladies: We have found that loose fitting or low neck blouses will allow for hot spent casings to be caught in your blouse. Though no long term injury will occur, the hot brass cartridge casing will cause a few seconds of pain on a sensitive area of the body. Therefore, we recommend that you wear something which will protect your neck and chest area from hot spent casings.

<u>Snakes:</u> Encounters with poisonous and dangerous rattlesnakes are a real possibility during warm weather. If you encounter a rattlesnake, calmly advise MTFI Staff so that it may be addressed safely.
